Dear Mr. Margolis:

Enclosed is the additional material I stated that I would be sending you. Like much of the other material I provided to the Attorney General, this material concerns actions of Independent Counsel attorneys in attempting to establish a conspiracy involving Deborah Gore Dean and John N. Mitchell.

With regard to the issue of whether the materials I provided the Attorney General should be first referred to Arlin M. Adams, the enclosed materials suggest further arguments against that course of action. If you are now fully familiar with the materials already provided, it should be evident to you that there is reason to believe that attorneys of the Office of Independent Counsel may not provide honest answers to questions regarding their understandings of the underlying facts, and the motivations for certain actions they took, in the prosecution of Deborah Gore Dean. The enclosed materials involve a variety of matters not previously brought to the attention of Independent Counsel attorneys. Investigation of these matters is more likely to reveal the truth if Independent Counsel attorneys are not informed of the content of the materials.
